News from our woods

Natterer's Wood

You may remember that a year ago we were concerned about brambles overwhelming trees in part of Natterer's Wood, and we had the brambles in that part of the wood flailed down to ground level (we left plenty of brambles for blackberry picking). When the trees came into leaf in the spring, we found that many were Swedish whitebeam, and other on-native species that had seeded in as part of our natural regeneration zone in the wood. Natural regeneration was effortless but has created patchy woodland. In January we'll plant native trees into the larger gaps, to enrich the species present and make a more dense woodland. The trees will also absorb carbon dioxide as they grow thus contributing a tiny amount to reducing the polluting effects of using our cars or other fossil fuel use.

Please come and join us on 13th January at 10am. The woodland floor will have plenty of low-growing bramble so wear tough boots and tough trousers; at least one of us may get scratched by their thorns so do be careful.

Cherry Trees Wood

Some time ago, we reached an informal agreement with Taylor Wimpey and West Suffolk Council that we would have a substantial input to Cherry Trees Wood. Now that development is progressing next to the wood, we hope that the substantial input will be placed on a more formal basis soon. In the meantime we've programmed in a work party this spring to tidy up and to maintain the trees we planted there several years ago.

Forthcoming events

In June, our work party will be replaced by some fun wild flower identification. Nick Sibbett will show us how to identify some of the plants in Natterer's Wood, in the hay meadow and possibly outside it too. do come and learn the names of some of the plants we are conserving!

We will also visit Lackford Lakes together, with the date to be decided. Shall we go in spring, and listen for the nightingale? Or in the summer to



see many dragonflies hunting their aerial prey? Or on a winter's evening to watch clouds of starlings whirl around? Or see the winter-visiting wetland birds on the lake margins.

Also at Lackford Lakes, our own Nick Sibbett is talking about bats to wildlife trust members on 29th January. Its not a Woodland Ways event but open to all, and you are very welcome to go. for more information see <https://www.suffolkwildlifetrust.org/events/2020-01-29-bats-suffolk-and-beyond>.
