
Wildflower Meadow at Natterer's Wood

After the work party on 10 June at Natterer's Wood, some of us had a walk through the wildflower meadow.

Nick and Jane identified the following flowers – yellow rattle, broomrape, red clover, white clover, vetch, birds-foot trefoil, daisy, buttercup, ribwort plantain, bee orchid, selfheal, common mouse-ear, ox-eye daisy, dandelion, yellow flag iris, germander speedwell, wood false brome, poppy, hawkweed and ragwort.

These flowers are mostly at their best in June and July. Some of their seeds may have laid dormant for 40 years or more. How many can you spot? Can you identify any more?

The grass will be cut in August and raked off to encourage the growth of more flowers in future years.

<u>May Work party</u> - Weeding and mulching trees at Natterer's Wood. Painting the container fence at Pond Covert completed.

May Visit to Bradfield Woods – owned and managed by Suffolk Wildlife Trust. Twenty Woodland Ways members walked through the woods with site manager Pete Fordham who introduced us to the amazing diversity of species in this ancient woodland. The new information centre is an impressive new facility constructed of locally sourced oak and cedar. Thanks to Gillian Jane Nick and Duncan for organising the walk and the lovely barbecue.

<u>June work party</u> - work continued weeding and mulching at top end of Natterer's Wood. These trees were planted 10 years ago and, after a slow start, are now more established. Thanks to Janet for finding a small new patch of common spotted orchids.

New Oak trees- At our work party on 10th June we planted a 3m tall oak tree to commemorate Queen's Diamond Jubilee. The tree is close to the oak tree planted by members of Age UK on 7th June. 1952 seems like a long time ago. Maybe your grandchildren will sit in the shade of these oak trees in 2072, in another 60 years time!
