The annual review of Woodland Ways achievements is always interesting. Everyone Welcome. If you wish to stand for election as a trustee please contact Nick Sibbett.



CHERRY TREES WOOD

In the winter we cleared elder and overgrown Christmas trees from Cherry Trees Wood, and planted the first Cherry trees of the wood, along with hazel and other woodland shrubs. Over the coming years we will gradually continue this process until the wood is in good shape.

We named the wood 'Cherry Trees' after Cherry Trees Farm, now known as the Flying Fortress pub.

SWANS AT WELNEY MARSHES

On a cold day in February, a group of us visited Welney Marshes, in Norfolk, to see the swans which visit the area every winter as a refuge from the even-colder Scandinavian and Russian wetlands.

POND COVERT

Variegated Yellow Archangel continues to spread and was too daunting to remove by hand. Dennis and Owen Green used an industrial 'weed-wand' in February to flame off this damaging plant, but there was limited success. Woodchip was spread on paths and box hedging was weeded.
